Answer 4: The theme “**Quaternary Sciences as Societal Service**” underscores the critical role of Quaternary research in addressing contemporary societal challenges. The Quaternary period, spanning the last 2.6 million years, has been pivotal in shaping Earth's climate, landscapes, ecosystems, and human civilizations. Understanding past changes is essential for building sustainable solutions for the future.

This theme highlights the **applied and interdisciplinary nature of Quaternary sciences** in benefiting society. The Organizing Committee (OC) envisions the conference as a platform to explore the following key aspects:

Sr	AS PER RFP	QUERY
1	Should have experience of having organized destination promotion at the International Conferences during last 5 years (excluding 2020-21) and have the experience of organizing at least 10 National/ International events, and a destination promotion event at an International conference (documentary proofs to be provided).	The term "destination promotion at International Conference" is quite broad and may not be clearly mentioned in past work orders, as different clients use varied terminologies such as "event marketing," "event promotion," or "event management." Given this variation, we seek clarification on whether experience in event marketing, branding, and promotion, Marketing communication—even if not specifically labeled as "destination promotion"—would be considered valid for eligibility.
2	Not mentioned in the tender document	There is no mention of exemption of Tender fee for MSME registered companies. Request you to provide exemption of tender fee for MEME registered companies
3	Not mentioned in the tender document	In the submission of EOI, there is no mention of Technical presentation. So whether its required or not or it is to be intimated later to the qualified agencies only.
4	Not mentioned in the tender document	We request an extension of the submission deadline to allow adequate time for preparing the necessary documents for such a comprehensive and competitive bid.
5	Should be working on a globally used software platform to manage online registrations, abstract submissions and financial transactions; to specify the conference management software to be used with justification	we understand that the requirement to use a globally recognized conference management software for registration is part of the event management . Specifying the software at the bidding stage may limit participation, as different agencies use various effective platforms. Instead of making it eligibility point, allowing the selected agency to propose and implement a suitable software solution as part of the execution phase would ensure flexibility while meeting the event's needs.

Answer 1: By Destination promotion, we mean to promote Lucknow (the venue of the congress) scientifically and culturally to the global community while promoting the conference.

Answer 2: At this EOI stage, BSIP has not requested any fee. Exemption for Annual Turnover and experience requirements for the MSME and start-up firms may be considered/decided by the competent authority at a later stage.

Answer 3: For the Request for Proposal (RFP) stage, both technical and financial submissions will be requested from all bidders who qualify in the Expression of Interest (EOI) stage. Based on the RFP submissions, the technical and financial bids will be evaluated, and shortlisted bidders will be invited for a presentation.

Answer 4: No extension of the deadline is considered at present
